THE IMAGINATION TREE

You will need:

- * a piece of wood or a log
- * elastic bands
- * hammer
- * nails

Hammer the nails in to the wood (children can do this!)

Let the children stretch the bands over the nails.

Make patterns! Take them off and start again.

Good for practising tool use, hand/eye coordination, fine motor skills, concentration and exploration of cause and effect.
